

Since late 2022, they have been supporting cycling and active transportation events, presenting to community leaders, gathering voices, and partnering with other community organizations to support people wanting to cycle and use alternative forms of transportation in our community.

A representative from Streets for All says they do what they do because it feels good to actively do something which benefits everyone. Whether they ride a bike or just breath the air, everyone wins when our air is cleaner and our streets are safer. One of the most rewarding parts of working for the organization is supporting children so they can ride their bicycles on our streets again - when this happens, the smiles are infectious and the empowerment is uplifting!

Streets for All has partnered with the Williams Lake Film Club, Canadian Mental Health Association, BGC Williams Lake and the Williams Lake Cycling Club for events and hope to continue to build partnerships across the community.

They will be taking part in a number of events in May leading up to Spring Go By Bike Week, and plan to attend the Bike Rodeo, where children learn some skills and get their helmets and bikes checked. In addition, they plan to attend the Children's Festival and lead an Elder College course.
